

Medical Enrollment Deferment Application

Conditions and Qualifications:

1. Students must be admitted to, and have attended, their first semester at BYU-Idaho.
2. Deferments of any type may not be used in consecutive semesters.
3. Students who have an Honor Code restriction or did not attend their previous on-track semester do not qualify.
4. Students who plan to interrupt their studies for more than one semester should contact the Admissions Office for appropriate reapplication materials.
5. Following the deferred semester, students must re-enroll at the university for the next available semester of their assigned track.

Instructions to the Applicant:

1. Fill out page 1 of this form and submit it to the following offices to be reviewed and signed:

2. Students who have registered for courses during the deferment period should officially withdraw from those courses prior to submitting this form.
3. Complete page 2 of this form with your current ecclesiastical leader. They should submit this form to the Admissions Office.

* Note: If you completed a Continuing Endorsement during the current semester, please have the Student Honor Office send a copy to the Admissions Office.
4. Submit a letter from a qualified medical professional verifying:
 - Your medical condition
 - When you will be able to return to school
5. **Deadline:** The last day to withdraw from school and receive "W" grades and not the grades earned. For specific dates, please see the academic deadlines at www.byui.edu/srr.
6. The student will be notified by mail when a decision has been made.

Honor Code Statement:

We believe in being honest, true, chaste, benevolent, virtuous, and in doing good to all men. . . . If there is anything virtuous, lovely, or of good report or praiseworthy, we seek after these things. — *13th Article of Faith*

As a matter of personal commitment, faculty, administration, staff, and students of Brigham Young University, Brigham Young University–Hawaii, Brigham Young University–Idaho, and LDS Business College seek to demonstrate in daily living on and off campus those moral virtues encompassed in the gospel of Jesus Christ, and will:

- Be honest
- Live a chaste and virtuous life
- Obey the law and all campus policies
- Use clean language
- Respect others
- Abstain from alcoholic beverages, tobacco, tea, coffee, and substance abuse
- Participate regularly in Church services
- Observe Dress and Grooming Standards
- Encourage others in their commitment to comply with the Honor Code

Specific polices embodied in the Honor Code include (1) the Academic Honesty Policy, (2) the Dress and Grooming Standards, (3) the Residential Living Standards, and (4) the Continuing Student Ecclesiastical Endorsement Requirement (refer to institutional policies for more detailed information).

Dress and Grooming Standards:

The dress and grooming of both men and women should always be modest, neat, and clean, and consistent with the dignity adherent to representing The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and any of its institutions of higher education.

Modesty and cleanliness are important values that reflect personal dignity and integrity, through which students, staff, and faculty represent the principles and standards of the Church. Members of the BYU, BYU–H, BYU–I, and LDSBC communities commit themselves to observe these standards, which reflect the direction given by the Board of Trustees and the Church publication *For the Strength of Youth*. These guiding principles apply at all CES institutions of higher education. The application of these principles may vary slightly at the various institutions in accordance with local conditions and circumstances (see separate institutional policies for more specific details on dress and grooming standards). The Dress and Grooming Standards are as follows:

Men: A clean and well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Hairstyles should be clean and neat, avoiding extreme styles or colors and trimmed above the collar, leaving the ear uncovered. Sideburns should not extend below the earlobe or onto the cheek. If worn, mustaches should be neatly trimmed and may not extend beyond or below the corners of the mouth. Men are expected to be clean-shaven; beards are not acceptable. Earrings and other body piercing are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn in all public campus areas.

Women: A clean well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Clothing is inappropriate when it is sleeveless, strapless, backless, or revealing; has slits above the knee; or is form-fitting. Dresses and skirts must be knee-length or longer. Hairstyles should be clean and neat, avoiding extreme styles and colors. Excessive ear piercing (more than one per ear) and all other body piercing are not acceptable. Shoes should be worn in all public campus areas.

Ecclesiastical Endorsement:

An LDS student must be endorsed by their current Bishop:

If the applicant is excommunicated, disfellowshipped, on formal or informal probation, or if the student has requested that his or her name be removed from LDS Church records, the student should not be endorsed.
