



Ted S. Warren is a staff photographer with the Associated Press (AP) in Seattle. He began his career in 1993 with a photo internship at the Los Angeles Times while a student at the University of Texas at Austin. He was then hired as a staff photographer at the Austin American-Statesman during his last two years of college and worked there until 1998. In 1999, after a year of freelancing in central Massachusetts, he joined the AP as a staff photographer and photo editor in Chicago, and transferred to Seattle in 2003.

Brother Warren enjoys the variety of photojournalistic opportunities that come with working for the AP, but he particularly enjoys large-scale environmental stories and covering major sporting events nationally and internationally.

For the past year, Brother Warren has been a member the A.P.'s Video Essay team, shooting, editing, and producing video essays to illustrate A.P. news stories. He is also part of the team currently training other A.P. Photographers to shoot video and record audio using the new Canon 5D MKII still-video hybrid camera.

Brother Warren sees the integration of video and still-photography storytelling as an immersive way to document the news of the day and an intimate way to share the voices of people with many different perspectives with a global audience.
