

1. Open your image



2. Choose the text tool and place the cursor at the top right corner of the photo. Spread the text box large enough to bleed off the image.

3. Choose a simple font and size for your text. Play around with the space in between each row of text, so it is evenly spaced. Select a color for your text that will provide good contrast with your image. White or black work well with most photos

4. Once you have your text settings selected, type the word or the phrase that you want to appear on the photo. Copy that word or phrase until your text box is full of text and appears across the entire image.

5. Reduce the opacity of the text in the layers palette to it blend with the image.

6. Copy the layer (apple/cntrl J). Move the next text layer on the image so it is off set with the original text layer. You can also increase or decrease the opacity to create more contrast between the two layers. Once you have the two layers covering the entire image, hide one of the layers so you can work with each one separately.



7. Create a mask on the visible layer. Select the erase tool and choose a soft brush to delete the parts of the image you don't want the text covering.

8. Copy the mask to the other text layer and erase or add to the photo depending on where the masked blocked it out.
